The Council's target of 245 per year, 91 above the objectively assessed need of 174, is based on there being a far greater uptake in employment opportunities in Melton than deemed likely, on historic and other factors, in the Strategic Growth Plan. (245 dwellings per year should not be referred to as Objectively Assessed Need anywhere in the Local Plan.)

In MBC's scenario Melton would remain the travel hub for commuting both via existing public transport links and principally by car. There would only be a proportionate increase in cross county travel.

The thrust of the argument in the Inspector's additions to 4.2.2 is that 2275 houses, above the objectively assessed need, are now to cater principally for unmet need in Leicester City itself and surrounding areas. By definition the "need" in these areas is based on the work and business operations in these locations.

Moving the associated housing to Melton, and even out into the Melton Borough villages, requires the Plan to consider effectively building dormitories that would only increase unsustainable travel to work. It did not assume this and there needs to be additional travel provision and other infrastructure provisions not currently considered for the Local Plan to be sound.

Unless Leicester City and other authorities are not planning to build homes at the rate actually required, unmet need will only occur in the last five years of the plan period.

There are no provisions to automatically re-assess the plan if the hoped for expansion of employment in Melton above the Strategic Growth predictions does not happen.

There may be a need for a full or partial review of the Local Plan if

- the expansion in employment opportunities in Melton, above the Strategic Growth predictions, does not happen or is significantly lower than hoped for.
- there is very significant allocation of unmet need in Leicester City and elsewhere creating dormitories and requiring additional travel and associated infrastructure

Appendix 5 monitoring framework is one where in "column 2" 245 homes is suggested to be an "Objectively Assessed Need" which it is not.

The CK&B Parish Council represents a rural community who have expressed 100% support in consultations on the Neighbourhood Plan for protection of the landscape.

It is believed that the proposed alterations actually provide a lesser standard that in NPPF paragraph 109, which is quoted by the Inspector in justification of the proposed changes. Particular attention is drawn to the wording emboldened and underlined.

109. The planning system should **contribute to and enhance the natura**l and local environment by:

- protecting and enhancing valued landscapes, geological conservation interests and soils
- recognising the wider benefits of ecosystem services
- minimising impacts on biodiversity and <u>providing net gains in biodiversity where</u> <u>possible</u>, contributing to the Government's commitment to halt the overall decline in biodiversity, including by establishing coherent ecological networks that are more resilient to current and future pressures
- preventing both <u>new and existing development</u> from contributing to or <u>being put at unacceptable risk</u> from, or being <u>adversely affected</u> by unacceptable levels of soil, air, water or noise pollution or land instability
- remediating and mitigating despoiled, degraded, derelict, contaminated and unstable land, where appropriate

The introductory paragraph does not use the caveat of "where possible" and this should not be inserted in the first line of Policy EN1- Landscape.

The only use of the caveat "where possible" in NPPF Para 109 is in the third bullet regarding providing <u>net gains</u>.

Consequently it should not be added elements to minimising effects that has the potential effect of permitting development where otherwise it would be prevented.

The words "unacceptable" and "adverse" are only applied in NPPF Para 109 fourth bullet to soil, air, water and noise pollution that can be physically measured. The liberal insertion in Policy EN1 of these words is not accepted as it again has the potential effect of permitting development where otherwise it would be prevented.

Further and alternatively, the insertion of the words without a set standard or identification of an independent body to rule on them is not acceptable. See lack of compatibility with MM17 and 7.6.3 which is supported.

It is accepted that there is a link between the words "unacceptable" and "adverse" in NPPF para 109 to noise pollution and Hence to tranquillity, this is addressed below.
